At YMCA Newark & Sherwood, our commitment to community is not a programme or an initiative it's our North Star.

The YMCA Community & Activity Village is a not-for-profit facility built with a single purpose: to ensure every child and young person has the opportunity to discover who they are and what they can become. That mission shapes our operations, informs our partnerships, and guides how we reinvest every pound back into our community.

The Village welcomes hundreds of thousands of visitors every year. From early morning to late evening, our spaces are filled with activity: children arriving for climbing, young people in cooking or creative sessions, football teams on the pitches, babies starting nursery, and families meeting for coffees and attending seasonal events. Yet for many, what they experience is only a glimpse of our wider impact.

As a charity, our vision is simple: to be a place where everybody feels valued, welcomed and at home. Created to bring together young people, families and the wider community, The Village offers opportunities to:

- Belong: a welcoming place to come for support and motivation.
- Contribute: develop skills, qualifications and training while exploring new opportunities.
- Thrive: find inspiration and confidence to become the best you can be.

We deliver these opportunities through health and wellbeing, hospitality and entertainment, childcare, youth programmes, and by providing space for organisations to base and grow their business.

Children and young people are at the heart of everything we do. We believe every young person deserves access to nurturing, non-judgemental and safe environments where they can develop their interests and fulfil their potential.

COMMUNITY & HOSPITALITY

Spaces that bring people together

Community connection is at the core of The Village. Our Café has become a gathering space for all ages, offering comfort, companionship and routine. Bob, a familiar face, visited regularly with his wife Diane before she sadly passed away. Today, our Café team continue to welcome him daily, offering not just a friendly smile but also comfort and community during a difficult time.

We also host Meet and Eat, a monthly Café event offering older residents a goodquality hot meal at a low cost. It reduces isolation, sparks conversation and fosters new friendships. Alongside this,

our programme of live events – from jazz nights and brass bands to DJ sets and tapas evenings - ensures our community offer appeals across generations.

Our conference and meeting spaces play an integral role in Newark's economic and social life. Home to Newark Business Club, one of the district's most influential networks, a hub for training, team away days and award ceremonies, these spaces support both community life and local economic growth. By generating income through commercial hire, we reinvest directly into our charitable programmes while also creating supply chain opportunities and bringing footfall into Newark.

TRAINING & EDUCATION

Spaces that support learning and growth

The YMCA Village has become a trusted venue for training, education and professional development, offering flexible spaces that adapt to the diverse needs of local organisations. Our classrooms, meeting rooms and conference facilities provide a professional yet welcoming environment where educators, businesses and community groups can bring people together to learn, collaborate and grow.

You Can Do Sport students benefit from our classroom, combining their studies with hands-on sport facilities within The Village. Our spaces are also chosen by East and West Midlands Ambulance Services, who

run essential training for paramedics on site, and by recruitment specialists such as Ambitions Personnel, who use our rooms for interviews and candidate assessments. In the past, our classrooms were also regularly used by ASI students from Lincoln College Group, who valued the modern, supportive environment provided by The Village.

The range of organisations that use our facilities is broad, from Skanska, a construction firm developing infrastructure in the Newark area, to Newark Rugby Club and local services supporting victims of crime through the justice system. All value our spaces, the support of our friendly team and the ease of access. With many returning time and again, The Village continues to play a central role in professional training and education across the district.



MACMILLAN

Bringing cancer support closer to home

Having Macmillan Cancer Support based at The Village has transformed local access to care. Families affected by cancer can now find advice, emotional support and practical guidance in a familiar, welcoming

environment. Instead of travelling or facing clinical settings, people come to a community space where health, wellbeing and connection are central.

Visitors often combine appointments with a coffee in the Café or a walk around the local area, making the experience less isolating. The presence of Macmillan at The Village reflects our belief that wellbeing is about more than treatment, it's about dignity, comfort and belonging.

Partnerships with purpose

Partnerships with local businesses are central to our impact. Our relationship with Bellway East Midlands is a powerful example. In summer 2025, Bellway funded scholarships enabling children from Newark schools to attend Camp Williams. For families who would otherwise miss out, this created opportunities for fun, friendship and confidence-building that last well beyond the holidays.

Their support extends further. From backing fundraising events such as the YMCA Speed Quiz, and sponsoring pitch side boards at our football facilities, to gifting their new homeowners six months of free YMCA membership, this partnership helps us embed YMCA into the fabric of local life.

Our partnership with YMCA means we can help open doors for young people in Newark, giving them the chance to build confidence, discover new opportunities and feel part of their community.

Health and wellbeing for every generation

The Village is more than a sports facility, it is a grassroots hub for wellbeing and connection. Almost every local football club uses our pitches, while families, schools and community groups come together for events and fundraisers that extend far beyond the boundaries of The Village.

With world-class facilities – including our climbing centre, strength and conditioning gym, running track and packed studio timetable, we support people of all ages to stay active, healthy and engaged.

Our Legends group is one our popular cohorts, designed for older adults to build strength, fitness and confidence. Sessions have expanded due to demand, with many participants trying climbing and Yoga for the first time and forming strong friendships both in and out of the gym.

Alan Davidson, 69, is a daily face at The Village, using the gym and running track. For him, The Village is not only a fitness space but also where his mental wellbeing is nurtured. Earlier this year, Alan joined the YMCA Yorkshire Three Peaks challenge, raising £531 for YMCA Scholarships.

Investing in Early Years

Our YMCA Nursery has quickly earned a strong reputation for its nurturing, imaginative and child-led approach.

Designed to support exploration, independence and creativity, the nursery draws on youth development research to create learning environments where every child is seen and supported as an individual. We see children grow in confidence and capability every day.

Children are encouraged and praised for living our Core Values of honesty, respect,

responsibility and caring. They love to recognise these behaviours in themselves and their friends, and we celebrate them with 'thank-yous' and certificates. It's a fun but impactful way of shaping social and emotional development – helping children grow into kind, thoughtful, community-minded individuals.

YMCA Nursery is also part of the government's Care to Learn scheme, which supports parents under 20 to access childcare while continuing their education. By helping young parents thrive, we create opportunities not just for children, but for whole families.

CAMP WILLIAMS

Supporting Working Families

School holidays can present real challenges for families in Newark & Sherwood. For many parents, balancing work and childcare is stressful and costly.

Camp Williams has become a trusted solution, offering reliable, affordable provision for ages four to 15 every school holiday from 8am to 6pm.

The difference lies in the blend of fun and personal growth. Children enjoy full days of sport, creative workshops, outdoor adventures and team-building activities. They grow in confidence, discover hidden

talents, and for many, Camp becomes the highlight of their school break. For parents, it's peace of mind: knowing their children are safe, supported and thriving.

Demand continues to grow exponentially. This year alone, Camp Williams has delivered 78,600 hours of childcare for parents, with 25 children supported through YMCA Scholarships this summer.

Camp Williams is not just childcare – it's a place where confidence grows, friendships are made and memories last a lifetime.

YMCA SCHOLARSHIPS

Making opportunities affordable and accessible

Financial pressure too often limits access to opportunities. That's why the YMCA Scholarship Programme is a cornerstone of our community model. Scholarships ensure that cost is never a barrier to belonging, covering up to 50% of membership or school holiday places for families facing hardship.


of Y-Kids and Youth Members are supported through YMCA Scholarships More than 17% of young people at The Village are supported through scholarships, and those children are often among our most engaged participants. They benefit not only from activities, but also from pastoral support and a sense of community they might otherwise miss.

For Leo, the scholarship did more than make membership affordable – it opened the door to daily social interaction that wasn't possible before. As a homeeducated young person, he now has a place to make friends, join activities he loves and feel part of a group.

This approach keeps our model financially sustainable while remaining responsive to local need.

YOUTH PROGRAMMES

Supporting young people to reach their potential

Our programmes for children and young people are designed to build confidence, friendships and resilience, while ensuring young voices are heard. Since launching Y-Kids in April 2025, alongside our Youth Membership, we've created a flexible offer for families and young people to access a wide variety of activities.

Y-Kids (ages 5-10) offers everything from arts and crafts, animation and LEGO challenges to football, Clip 'n Climb, skateboarding, baking, Nerf Wars and science. As children grow, Youth Membership (ages 11-17) expands the offer with cooking workshops, DJ'ing and music production, climbing, street dance, cycling, multi-sports and access to our strength and conditioning gym.

Scholarships ensure inclusivity: more than 17% of youth members receive financial support, guaranteeing no child is left out.

The impact is clear. David, age seven, has attended almost every day since Y-Kids launched, and his mum has seen a remarkable boost in confidence and social skills. Kane, age 14, went from being disengaged to leading others in climbing sessions and choosing Food Technology as a GCSE inspired by our cooking workshops. Eleanor, age 15, began climbing with no experience and is now part of our development squad, mentoring younger climbers and competing nationally.


The Village is more than a building; it is a major contributor to the local economy.

We employ the full-time equivalent of over 160 people from Newark & Sherwood across childcare, hospitality,
